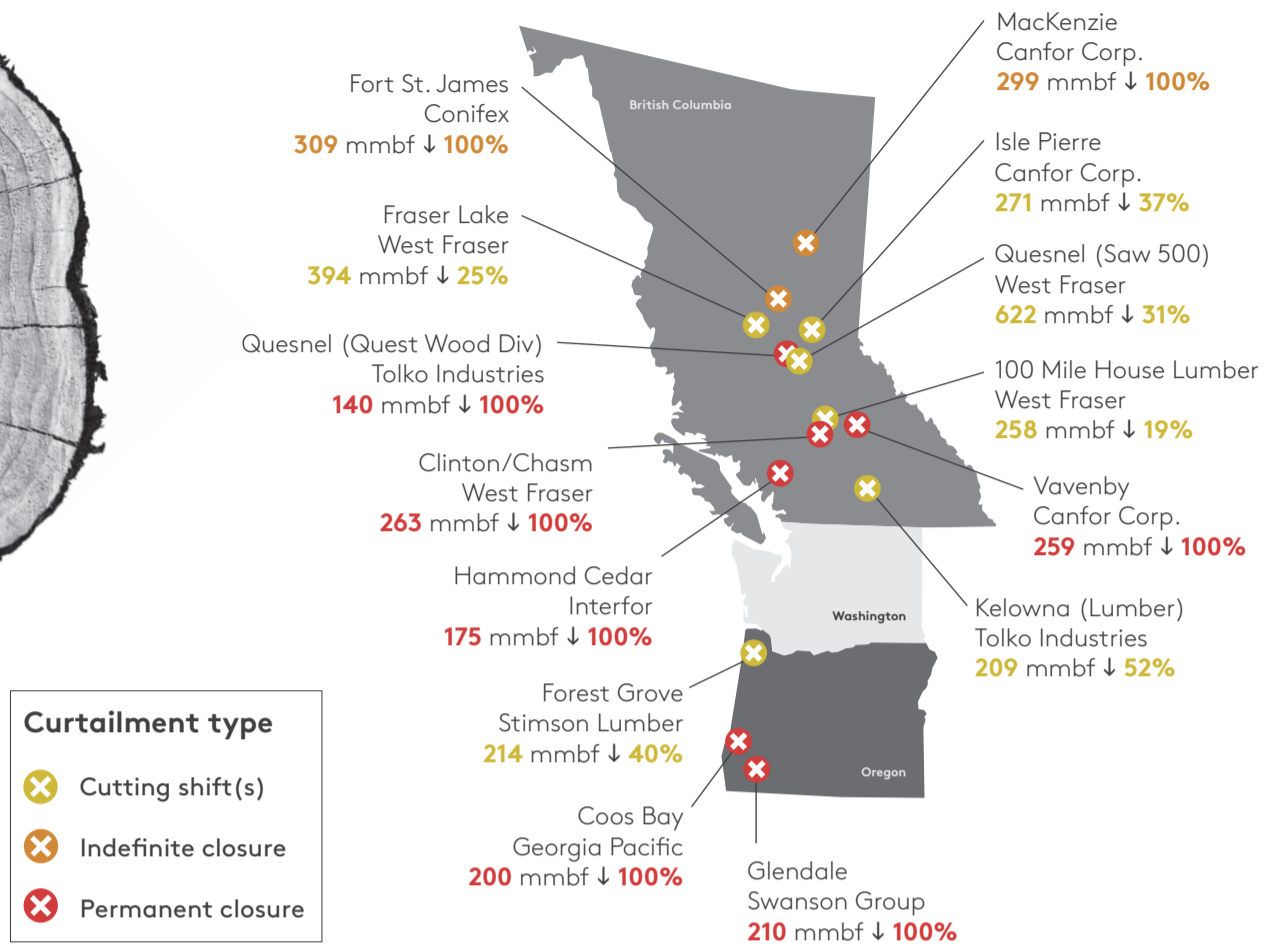


# Sawmill curtailments

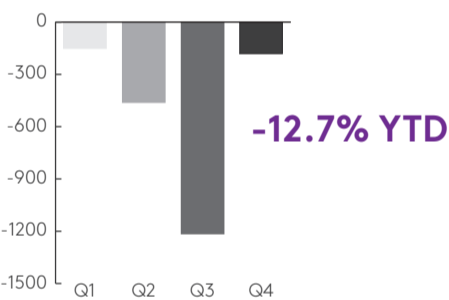
British Columbia and Pacific Northwest, as of Sept. 2019

Permanent/indefinite sawmill **curtailments swell to 2.5 BBF** in 2019, a **9% loss** in regional capacity since Q4 2018

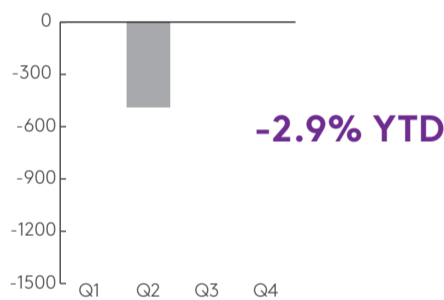


## Permanent/indefinite capacity curtailments to date in 2019 (MMBF)

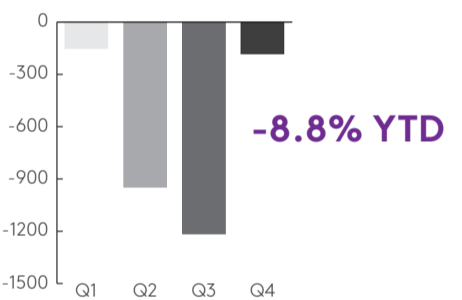
British Columbia



Pacific Northwest

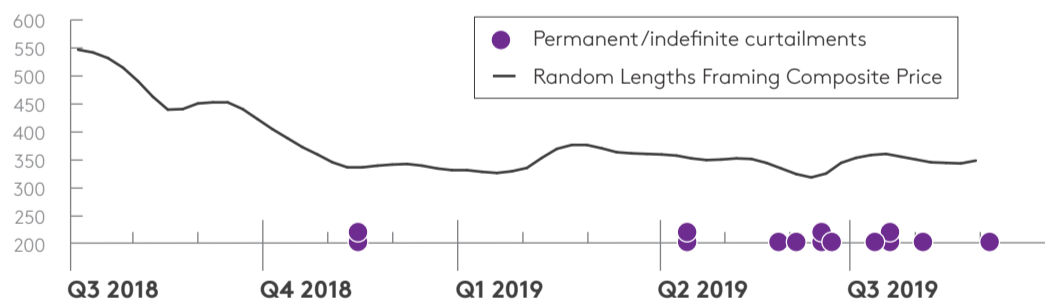


Combined BC and PNW
